Learning at home Physical skills—catching

Our children have begun learning the skill of catching.

This is very tricky and takes lots of practice.

You can practice this at home in lots of ways from making a bean bag with old socks and beans to enjoying the autumn leaves throwing them up in the air and trying to catch them.

We use a method to help children remember what to do when learning how to catch.

- 1. Keep your eyes on the bean bag
- 2. Butterfly fingers—fingers spread out to catch
- 3. Move to the bean bag—move to where it is falling.
